Cost of Admission

Admission to all walk-in gates -- \$3 per adult; \$2 per child (a child is 12 years of age and under); preschool is free. These admission charges prevail unless lesser charges are advertised at special times. Free Parking in designated areas.

General Rules & Regulations

1. **The Vernon Parish Fair officially opens at 3 pm, Wednesday, the week of the fair.**
2. **Pick up exhibits Sunday, 6-8 pm and Monday, 4-7 pm after the fair.**
3. The Vernon Parish Fair reserves to its Board of Directors the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations and arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions, and differences in regard thereto or otherwise arising out of, connected with or incident to the fair.
4. The Board of Directors reserves the right to amend or add to these rules as they, in their judgment, may deem advisable.
5. No premium will be awarded when the article is unworthy. In cases where only one exhibit is being exhibited in a section, the judge will make his award in accordance with the merits of the exhibit being exhibited, which may be first, second, third, etc. No premium will be awarded in any department except as definitely stated in this premium list. Decision of the judges will be final.
6. In no case will the Vernon Parish Fair Board of Directors be held responsible for any loss, damage, injury, or death or disease of any character, to any such property or persons, while same is on the Fairgrounds.
7. NO SNAKES are allowed in exhibits.

Entry Procedure

1. **All exhibitors must fill out an entry tag for each item entered and a summary sheet on all entries (one summary sheet per exhibitor).**
2. All exhibitors must be from Vernon Parish and will be responsible for entering, displaying, maintaining and removing their exhibits.
3. Entries in exhibit building will be received Saturday, September 28 from 8 am to 5 pm and Sunday, September 29 from 1 pm to 5 pm. No late entries will be accepted. Livestock, Poultry, Rabbits and Pets must

be entered through regular entry procedures as shown in fair schedule. Horses must be entered between 9:30 am to 10:30 am the day of the show (September 29).

Exceptions: Baked goods, flowers and potted plants must be entered according to the above schedule, but actual items must be in place by 8 am Tuesday, October 1 just prior to judging.

4. One free admission ticket per exhibitor good for 1 day will be given at the time entries are made.
5. To enter in adult divisions, a person must be out of high school.
6. Only exhibits made since last year's fair can be entered. No repeat entries.

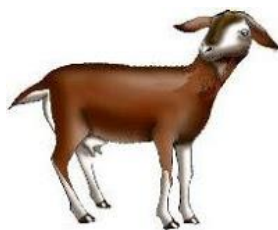

Section 9 – Forestry

(1st Place - \$3, 2nd Place - \$2, 3rd Place - \$1)

Rules:

- All exhibits must have been prepared this year.
- Leaves, woods, fruits, winter twigs and buds will be mounted on white cardboard 22 x 28 inches.
- The title shall be Tree Fruits, Leaves, Woods, Twigs or Buds across the 28-inch side of the cardboard. The title shall be 1/2 inch from the top and 1 inch in height.
- Mounting shall start 2 inches from the top and 2 inches from the left.
- In the lower right-hand corner, the exhibitor shall print his name, age, 4-H club, parish and post office.
- Advanced leaf collections should be made according to directions in the 4-H Forestry Project Book. That is:
 - A. Each specimen mounted individually on material 8 ½ x 11 inches exhibited in a loose-leaf ring binder.
 - B. A label about 2 ½ x 3 inches in size shall be glued at the lower right-hand corner. The label should contain the scientific and common name, general description of tree, location collected and collector's name.
 - C. The title on the folder should read "Tree Leaves of Louisiana".
- All exhibits must have 25 specimens.
- Junior – under 14 years of age on 12/31 current year.
- Senior – 14 years of age or older as of 12/31 current year.

Section 10 – Insect Collection

(1st Place - \$3, 2nd Place - \$2, 3rd Place - \$1)

Rules:

- All insects collected must have been collected within the last 12 months.
- Exhibits shall be enclosed in a wooden case 18 inches wide by 24 inches long by 3 ½ inches deep with a glass top.
- Each insect specimen shall have a collector's label showing the place collected (town, city, etc.), the date collected and name of collector. This label shall be centered ½ inch from the bottom of the case and read from the left side of the specimen.
- Specimens shall also be labeled as the common name (if specimen has a common name). This label shall be placed beneath the specimen flat on the bottom of the case with a pin through the center and read from the left side of the specimen.
- Specimens shall be grouped by orders.
- Specimens shall be positioned in the case where they will be facing forward when the case is horizontal.
- Exhibits shall be judged as follows:
 - A. Proper identification as to order – 1 point
 - B. Orders represented – 3 points
 - C. Proper identification as to common name – 1 point
 - D. Economic importance of specimen – 2 points
 - E. Condition of specimen – 1 point
 - F. Proper mounting – 1 point
 - G. Proper labeling – 1 point
 - H. Butterflies and moths properly counted – 2 points
 - I. Neatness and arrangement – 20 points
 - J. Correct size of case – 20 points
- The name, address, parish, age, 4-H Club, or FFA Chapter of the exhibitor shall be displayed on the outside of the glass in the lower right-hand corner of the case on a 1-inch x 3-inch card.
- Junior – under 14 years of age as of 12/31 current year
- Senior 14 years of age or older as of 12/31 current year
